Easter 6C:

Paul's Vision

Children will be invited to come to the front of the church to hear the story. The Desert Bag should be waiting in front of the Altar with the story materials beside it.

Acts 8:2-4

At that time the church in Jerusalem suffered terribly. All of the Lord's followers, except the apostles, were scattered everywhere in Judea and Samaria. Saul started making a lot of trouble for the church. He went from house to house, arresting men and women and putting them in jail.

The Lord's followers who had been scattered went from place to place, telling the good news.

Acts 9:1-19

Saul kept on threatening to kill the Lord's followers. He even went to the high priest and asked for letters to the Jewish leaders in Damascus. He did this because he wanted to arrest and take to Jerusalem any man or woman who had accepted the Lord's Way. When Saul had almost reached Damascus, a bright light from heaven suddenly flashed around him. He fell to the ground and heard a voice that said, "Saul! Saul! Why are you so cruel to me?"

"Who are you?" Saul asked.

"I am Jesus," the Lord answered. "I am the one you are so cruel to. Now get up and go into the city, where you will be told what to do."

Hold out the "letter" -- a scroll with a ribbon tied around it. Saul asked the High Priest to give him a letter to take to Damascus, so that he could arrest the Lord's followers in that city, too. Use an elastic band to put the letter in Saul's hand.

Roll out the road to Damascus (a strip of grey felt) at Saul's feet, and start moving Saul along it, until he is almost at the end. When Saul had almost reached Damascus, a bright light from heaven suddenly flashed around him. Open your fingers suddenly from behind Saul's head, like a flashing halo. He fell to the ground. Lay the doll down on its face.

He heard a voice that said "Saul! Saul! Why are you persecuting me?"

"Who are you?" Saul asked.

"I am Jesus" the Lord answered. "I am the one you are persecuting. Now, get up and go into the city, where you will be told what to do."

Stand Saul back up in his stand. Drop the letter, and leave it lying on the ground. When Saul got up from the ground and opened his eyes, he could not see a thing. Someone led him by the hand into Damascas. Move Saul off the end of the roadway.

Hold out the Ananias doll for the children to see. A follower
